# Town of Kingston (MA) Denies Sand Mining Permit!

On March 12, 2024, the Kingston Board of Selectmen denied a permit for a proposed sand mine on Indian Pond. Plympton Sand & Gravel sought a permit for millions of dollars in sand and gravel mining to process at its abutting commercial facility. In an attempt to exploit the legal loophole for "agriculture," the company claimed they would build a cranberry bog after the 5+ year operation. Read more here.

Residents in Wareham, Carver and Plymouth **continue to report new unpermitted sand mining operations to local officials and demand action.** Hundreds of trucks a day are permanently removing the vegetation, forests and sand and gravel that filter and protect the Plymouth Carver Sole Source Aquifer. Seven towns get their water from the Aquifer.

Over 120 comment letters were sent to the Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act (MEPA) office demanding a review of A.D. Makepeace's decade of environmental damage and deforestation from solar and sand mining. >> Read more here


