Two separate towns in New York are considering a moratorium on large renewable energy projects, as the towns decide how best to zone and site these projects. According to the <u>Niagara Gazette</u>, officials in the town of Niagara are proposing a six-month moratorium on processing new solar and wind project applications, as the Town decides how best to regulate and zone the projects. According to the article,

moratorium in place. The new moratoria would allow the Town's Energy Advisory Committee to update the Town code to better regulate these projects and protect Town residents. The Energy Advisory Committee was formed in Rotterdam to help draft new solar energy regulations. In the News - Offshore Wind Grid Connectivity According to the journal Commonwealth, the Canal Station peaker power plants in Sandwich, MA, may allow offshore wind turbines off the shores of Cape Cod to use its existing interconnections with the electrical grid to deliver wind energy to customers. Because the plant is a "peaker" plant, only firing up when there is a need for electricity, it has excess interconnectivity, which could be used by offshore wind

projects.
